Hi everyone! I am very pleased to announce that our permanent teacher position has been filled through the merit selection process. Mrs Amanda Church is the successful applicant, and has accepted the permanent classroom teacher position. Congratulations Amanda! Mrs Church will continue to contribute her extensive experience and expertise at our school which will benefit the learning of our students. Mr Chris Powys will continue teaching the Waratah class full time until Week 5, Term 4. Then Mr Powys and I will team teach the Waratah class for the remainder of the year.

Mrs Church will visit the Pre-School again this term. She is organising our Kindergarten Transition program to start from Wednesday, Week 3. Invitations will be sent to 2021 Kinder students. If you know anyone who may be interested please let us know. Parents are welcome to contact the school for information and to discuss enrolling children. **2021 K– 6 enrolments are welcome now.**

This survey closes on Friday 23 October.

As a team, we will meet with the External Validation Panel to evaluate our effectiveness tomorrow, (22nd October). We will use the findings and recommendations from this evaluation to inform our 2021-2024 school planning cycle. Thanks to our team; Leeanne, Rachel, Amanda and Chris.

All student Personal Learning Plans have been reviewed, and teachers have made phone calls to parents about student progress and where to next. Semester 2 Student Progress Reports will be as per the format of previous years, and we hope to meet with parents near the end of the term to review the PLPs and discuss the reports.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions being eased, we will be participating in our School Swimming Program at Gould Swim Centre during Weeks 5 and 8. We can proceed with the program under strict COVID-19 guidelines. We will ensure that we are not there with another school and the swim centre manager has assured me that they will clean between schools. We will be travelling to and from the pool by bus. Thanks to the P&C, the DoE School Swimming Grant and allocation of school funds we have been able to keep the cost down for families to \$50 per student for 10 lessons. *Permission notes are attached.*

Our next Assembly on Wednesday 28th October will be led by the Year 5 students, (our 2021 School Leaders).
















We have had a few birthdays in our class recently. Lara and Cooper, Georgia and Ms Johnston!

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


Waratah Classroom With Mr Powys

SCHOOL SWIMMING PROGRAM

Our Swimming Program will be held during:

Week 5 - Monday 9th November to Friday 13th November

Week 8 - Monday 30th November to Friday 4th December

Lessons will begin at 1.15pm and finish at 2.15pm. Students will leave school at 12.45pm and return by 3.00pm. During the swim scheme lunch will be at 11.40am and recess will be in the afternoon at 3.00pm.

Due to COVID 19 precautions we will not be using the change rooms, all students will change into/out of their swimmers at school. Students need to bring their swimmers, 2 towels, goggles, a drink bottle and a plastic bag for their wet towel and swimmers. The extra towel will be used to keep them dry on the bus.

If parents wish to pick students up directly from the pool they must notify the school prior to <u>11.00am</u>, and be at the pool promptly at the conclusion of the lesson, but please wait outside Gould Swim Academy and staff will escort students out of the venue to their transport.
