Hi everyone!

Good news! We have been successful in gaining Regional Renewal funding for new covered walkways between our classrooms. This will tie in nicely with our COLA project. Hopefully works will begin soon!

We will have some deadly visitors next week! The Deadly Australia tour will be at our school on Tuesday 25th May. Along with our friends from the Pre-school, we will learn about staying safe, and the importance of these animals to our ecosystem.

National Sorry Day is next Wednesday. This is observed annually on 26 May, to remember and acknowledge the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who were forcibly removed from their families and communities, which we now know as 'The Stolen Generations'. It provides a chance to focus on healing and pursue reconciliation in Australian society. The theme for 2021 is 'More than a word. Reconciliation takes action.' Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation.

The Year 4-6 students will be attending the Courage to Care program on Monday 31st May. This is a free exhibition at the Albury Library Museum which aims to highlight the importance of standing up to bullying, racism and discrimination. It promotes understanding and acceptance of people in our multicultural society. This program and transport is being provided free of charge for our school.

The Year 5/6 students will be attending the GRIP Leadership program in Albury on Wednesday 2nd June. Our students will collaborate with other students in our region to develop leadership skills and build positive relationships with peers.

Research Project: Parent Facilitating of Mathematics Education

Who am I?

My name is Jesseline Ingold and I am an Honours student at the University of Sydney researching parent and teacher experiences of mathematics teaching during the school shutdown period in 2020. My supervisor is Dr Heather McMaster (Mathematics Lecturer, The University of Sydney). I am in any 4th and final year of teaching and am passionate about improving rural education in NSW and Australia. Having grown up in a small rural town and completed a professional placement at a rural school in 2020, I am eager to improve the qualifity of rural education throughout my career.

What is this research about?

My study aims to understand the challenges of facilitating the teaching of mathematics in rural areas during the 2020 school shutdown, in the hope that should there be another shutdown for any reason, children's mathematics learning can continue successfully. The study aims to highlight how rural schools enacted remote learning in 2020, what worked well and what didn't, the value of the type of resources used, and any challenges faced by parents and teachers in communicating with each other.

How do I get involved?

By completing the survey found by following the QR code below. The survey takes about 5 – 10 minutes to complete. All survey data is confidential and anonymous and no contact information is required.

Participants can opt to provide a single email address to participate in an interview in which they will be invited to elaborate on their responses.
